Think and Sort

A **plural** is a word that names more than one thing. A **base word** is a word to which suffixes, prefixes, and endings can be added. All of the spelling words are plurals. Most plurals are formed by adding -s to a base word. Other plurals are formed by adding -es.

The spelling of some base words changes when -es is added. A final y is often changed to i. An f is often changed to v.

Look at the spelling words. Think about how each plural is formed. Spell each word aloud.
