Using the Spelling Table

If you need to look up a word in a dictionary but aren't sure how to spell it, a spelling table can help. A spelling table lists common spellings for sounds. Suppose you are not sure how the first vowel sound in *August* is spelled. First, look in the table to find the pronunciation symbol for the sound. Then read the first spelling listed for /ô/, and look up *Agust* in a dictionary. Look for each spelling in the dictionary until you find the correct one.
